Round Room celebrated in August by giving away a special Mega Grant! After two successful years in wireless, the budgeted amount for philanthropy was underestimated and the surplus provided quite the gift for seven Indianapolis area nonprofits.

WHY SEVEN, YOU MAY ASK?

At this time, Round Room had seven employee resource groups that met regularly to support common interests: one focused on prayer and encouragement, one on empowering black and brown team members, one supporting women employees, one for those who love fitness and health, one focused on mental health, one on mentoring, and one to shine light on their LGBTQIA+ community.

The 25+ Round Room employees in each resource group carefully considered multiple nonprofits that they aligned with, then each ultimately chose one organization that they thought deserved to win \$100,000. The seven finalists each presented for an hour to the Round Room Gives Board of Directors. The seven also each met with CEO Scott Moorehead prior to the presentation to help create a common document that shared their three-year strategy plan.

After meeting, the Round Room Board of Directors secretly decided to award all organizations with \$100,000, plus a \$60,000 transportation package, a common need in all the organizations. Still sitting on a surplus, the

additional \$580,000 true "Mega Grant" was presented to Dream Alive, one of the seven finalists! It was a fun process for the whole company and a huge impact to our Indianapolis community, distributing \$1.7M in 30 minutes!




RESCUES ROCK


